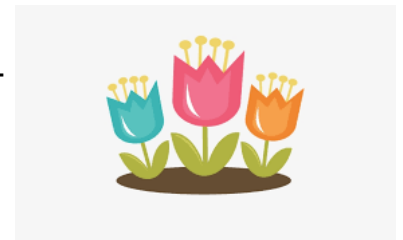

We would like to take this opportunity to describe for you the class placement process we undertake each year when placing students in classes. This process involves input from the sending and receiving teachers, administration, learning support teachers and any applicable support staff. In creating classes, the goal is always to work on creating the most effective and positive learning environment possible. This is dependent on many factors, one being classroom dynamics. We strive to ensure that classes are balanced by looking at students' academic levels, special needs in the areas of academics, socio-emotional and behavior profiles, as well as individual personalities which include student/student relationships and teacher/student relationships. Much time and effort are put into creating these learning environments and it is important to recognize that all of these factors influence one another. For this reason, we do not accept placement requests. We ask that you trust the school team which includes your child's teacher to place them in the best suited class and to understand that the teacher is not the only factor considered when placing your child in a class. We very much appreciate your support and understanding.

Canadian Parents for French

May 2024 FREE Virtual Programs for FSL Students

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Canadian Parents for French (CPF) association will be offering FREE after-school French language opportunities for French Immersion and Core French students in Grades 1 to 12 across the province remotely in May 2024. These voluntary programs are designed to develop students' oral proficiency, interest in reading, and build their confidence in French. They are fully funded by the Ministry of Education and are led by qualified FSL teachers or FSL teacher candidates currently enrolled in a Bachelor of Education program at an Ontario university.

Virtual Program Offerings:

- **“Franco-Fun”**: Students in Grades 1-8 will participate in fun and interactive games and activities, and will chat with new friends while building their French vocabulary, oral comprehension, and communication skills;
- **Reading Circle**: Students in Grades 1-8 will read books, poems, and articles while developing French vocabulary and reading comprehension skills;
- **“Vive la parole” Conversation Club**: Students in Grades 7-12 will engage in fun, theme-based games and interactive activities that spark oral communication in French and help students learn about Franco-Ontarian pop culture.
